NON INTERNET ACTIVITIES		
1. Have your child grab a handful of cheerios, macaroni, buttons or objects of your choice. Count the amount		
then count them backwards from the total amount. Put into groups of 2, 5 then 10. Did you get the same		
amount? Is the amount you have even or odd? Explain how you know. If you are out for a walk look at the		
house numbers on the street. Which side is even/odd? Draw a picture of your street when you get home with		
the house and house numbers. How do you know the number is even or odd?		
2. Play a card game- Sum War		
-Remove the kings and jacks (ace =1 and queen = 0). Each player turns over two cards and says the sum		
(answer to an addition question) of their 2 numbers. The person with the greater sum wins and takes the cards.		
Play until all cards are gone. The person with the most cards, wins! (You can also play with subtraction ©)
